Come up with a catchy title!

INTRODUCTION (1 paragraph)

- **Hook:** You must grab the readers' attention. Start with an interesting **quote** ("...") about the topic. Always give credit to the author of the quote.
- Thesis statement: What you believe about the topic (your position). Make a clear and one-sided stand!
- Sources (supporting evidence): List the sources you have selected and will be using to support your thesis. Choose your examples wisely – details about books, movies, songs, poems that you know well, or even personal experiences.

BODY (3 paragraphs)

- First Point: Topic sentence (link your thesis to your first source), explanation, and a closing statement.
- Second Point: Topic sentence (link your thesis to your second source), explanation, and a closing statement.
- **Third Point:** Topic sentence (link your thesis to your third source), explanation, and a closing statement.

CONCLUSION (1 paragraph)

You have described an issue (a problem). Now bring your essay to a close by offering a solution in detail.

EXTRA TIPS!

- Your essay should be divided in <u>5 paragraphs</u>.
- Choose your position wisely the side of the argument that you feel most passionate about.
- Make <u>clear links</u> (connections) between your ideas. See the document "Great Transitions".
- Avoid ideas that may be interesting but do not support your position.
- <u>Avoid overgeneralizing</u> by assuming that because something is true for a small group, it is true for all jumping to conclusions.
- <u>Avoid contradicting</u> your position.
