12. World War I boosted Canada's economy by increasing industrial production. Factories produced weapons, ammunition, ships, and other supplies needed for the war. Many jobs were created, especially for women who began working in factories and farms. However, the war also caused high government spending and national debt.
  
13. Conscription was controversial because many French Canadians believed the war mainly supported Britain and did not want to be forced to fight. English Canadians were generally more supportive. This disagreement created serious political and cultural divisions within Canada.
  
14. About 4,000 Indigenous men served in the Canadian military during the war. Many worked as soldiers, scouts, and snipers. Their skills in tracking and survival were highly valued. Despite their contributions, they still faced discrimination when they returned home.
  
15. Canada's strong participation in the war helped it gain greater international recognition. After the war, Canada signed the Treaty of Versailles and received its own seat in the League of Nations, which increased its independence from Britain.
