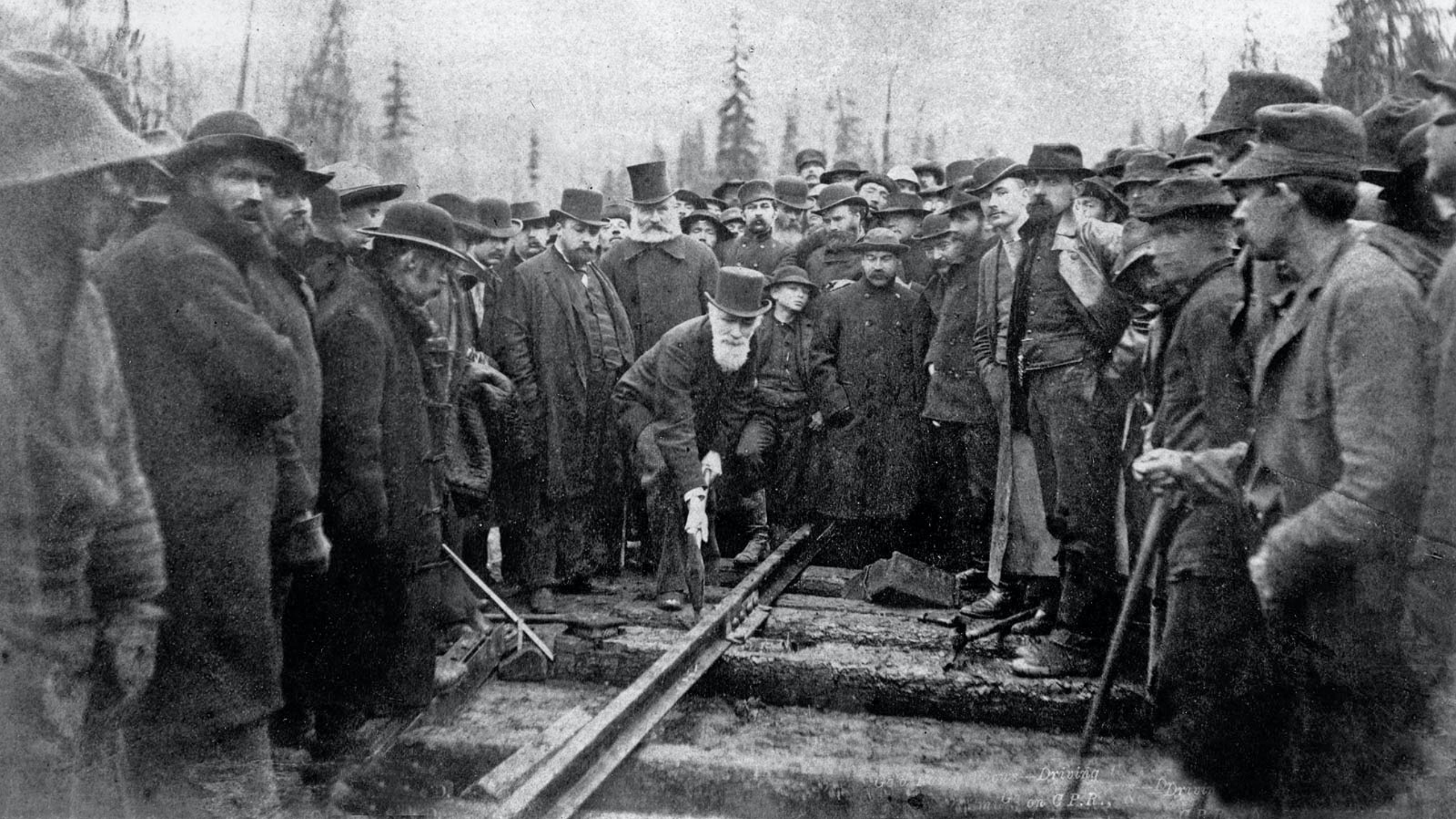

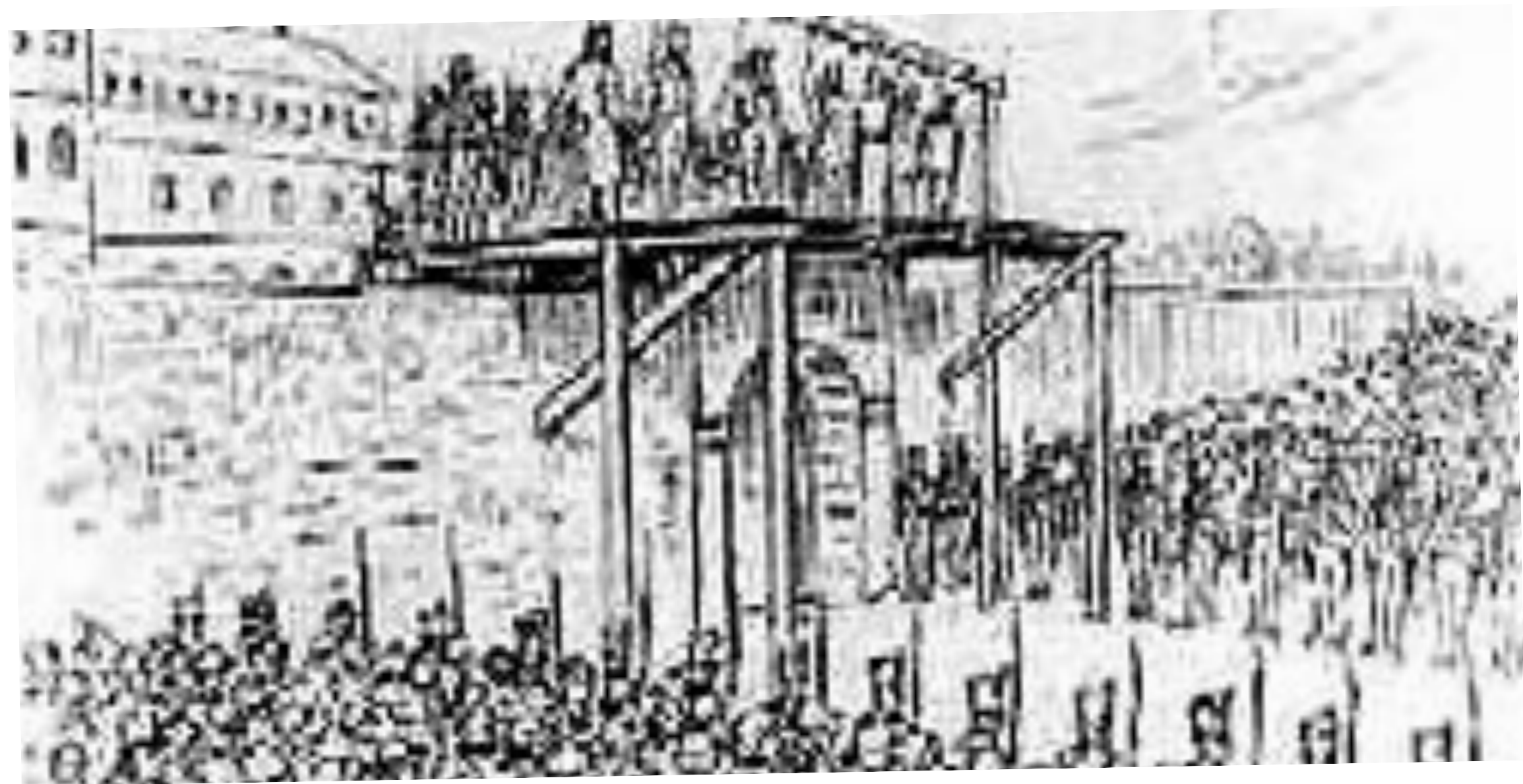






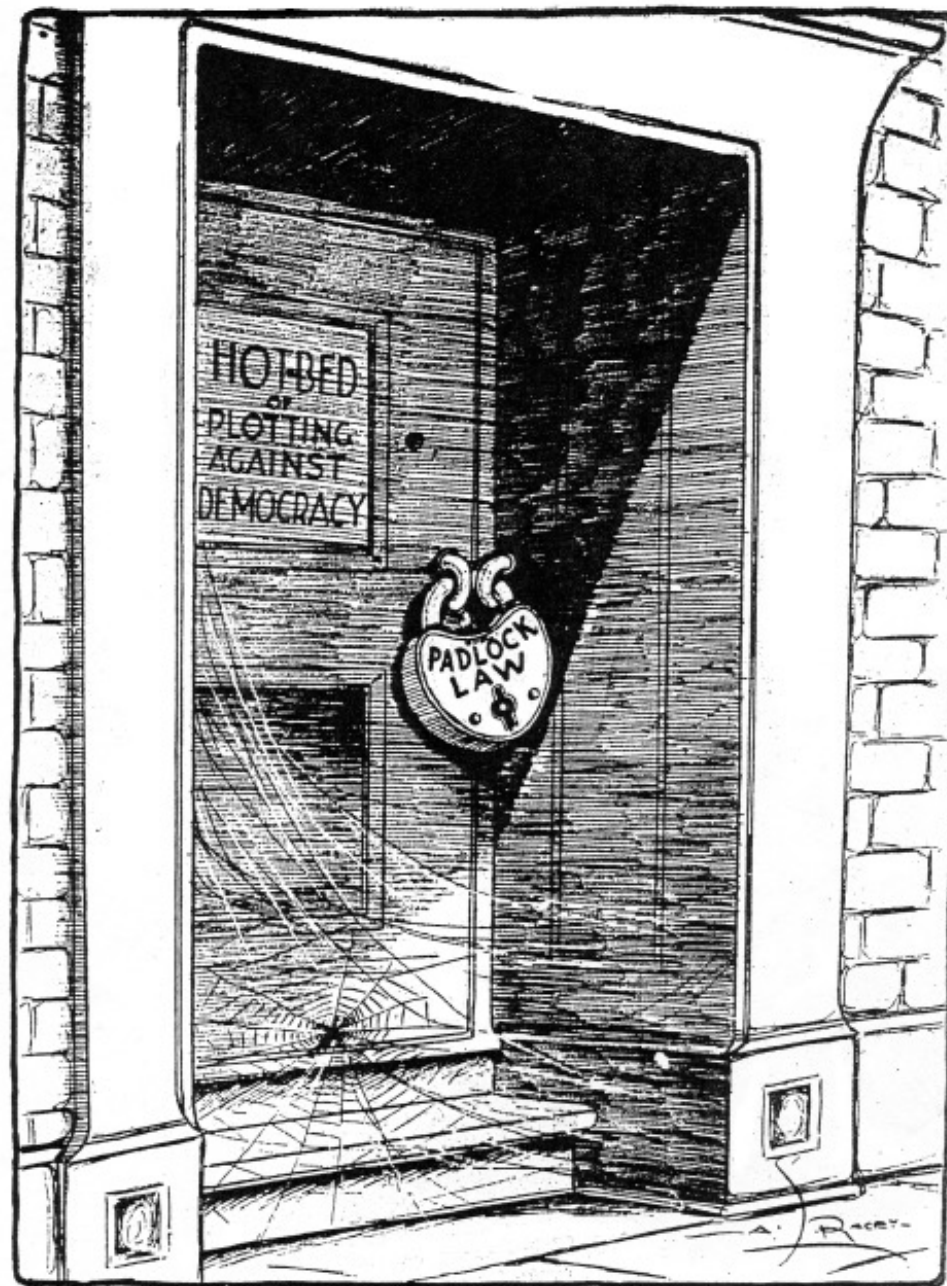

1977 – Bill 101, also known as the French Language Charter, is passed by a margin of 54-32 in Quebec’s legislature. It includes provisions that require **all commercial signs in Quebec to be in French only.**

1988 – Supreme Court of Canada decision strikes down the French-only provisions of the language charter. Quebec government invokes the **notwithstanding clause.**

1993 – Bill 86 is passed by Quebec’s Liberal government to incorporate changes to Bill 101 mandated by the 1988 Supreme Court decision. The updated bill **allows languages other than French to be included on commercial signs, but requires French to be “markedly predominant.”**

All children under 16 must receive their primary and secondary education in French schools, unless one of the child's parents has received most of their education in English, in Canada, or the child or the child's sibling has already received a substantial part of their education in English, in Canada.

Islamic dress



Hijab

- ◆ A scarf covering the head, ears and neck. The **face remains visible**
- ◆ Widely used in the Muslim world



Chador

- ◆ A long cloak covering the body, traditionally worn by **Iranian** women (especially **practising Muslims**)
- ◆ While the head is covered, the **face remains visible**



Niqab

- ◆ A full veil with a small **slit for the eyes**
- ◆ Its use has spread due to the influence of **Wahabi Islam** from Saudi Arabia
- ◆ Mainly used in urban areas



Burqa


- ◆ Full veil traditionally worn by Pashtuns in **Afghanistan**
- ◆ **Completely covers the head and body**, with a **mesh screen over the eyes**
- ◆ **Obligatory** under Taliban rule

The province's commitment to secularism, or *laïcité*, but also fine details like imposing a dress code on several categories of provincial civil servants, including police officers and teachers.

The law prohibits some civil servants from wearing “clothing, a symbol, jewelry, adornments, accessories or headwear” that is connected to a religious belief or could be “reasonably considered” as such.
