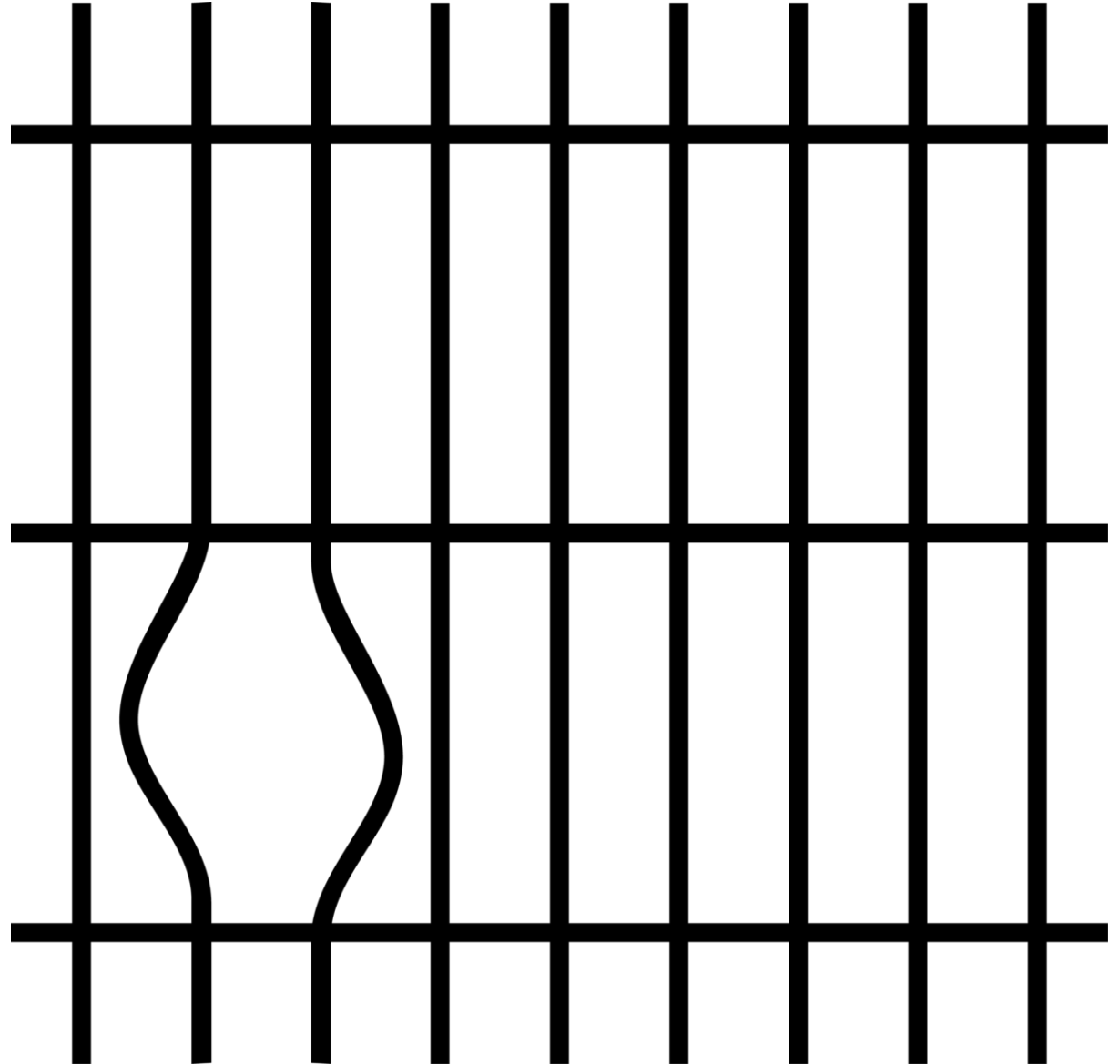

Alcatraz Prison



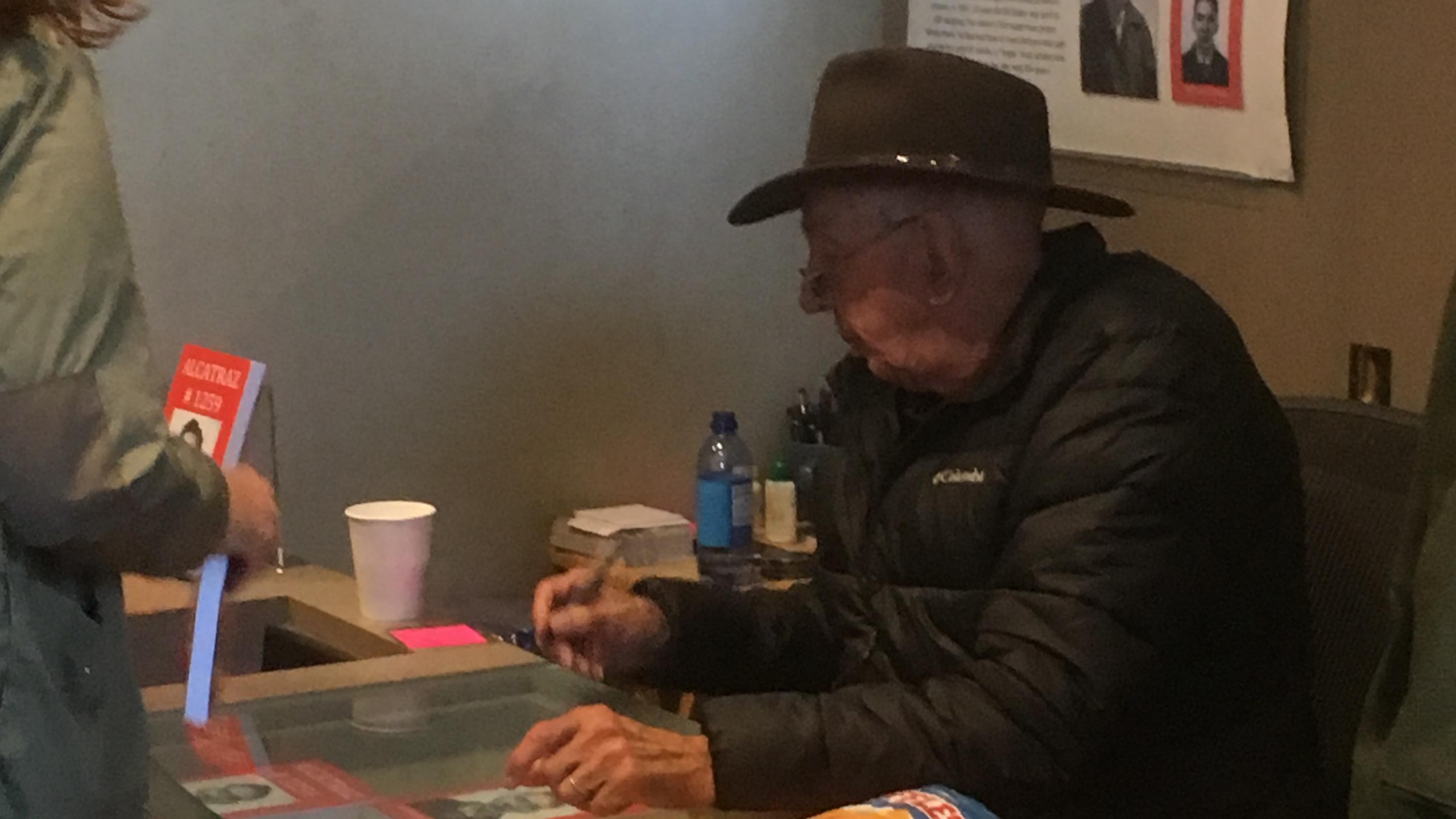

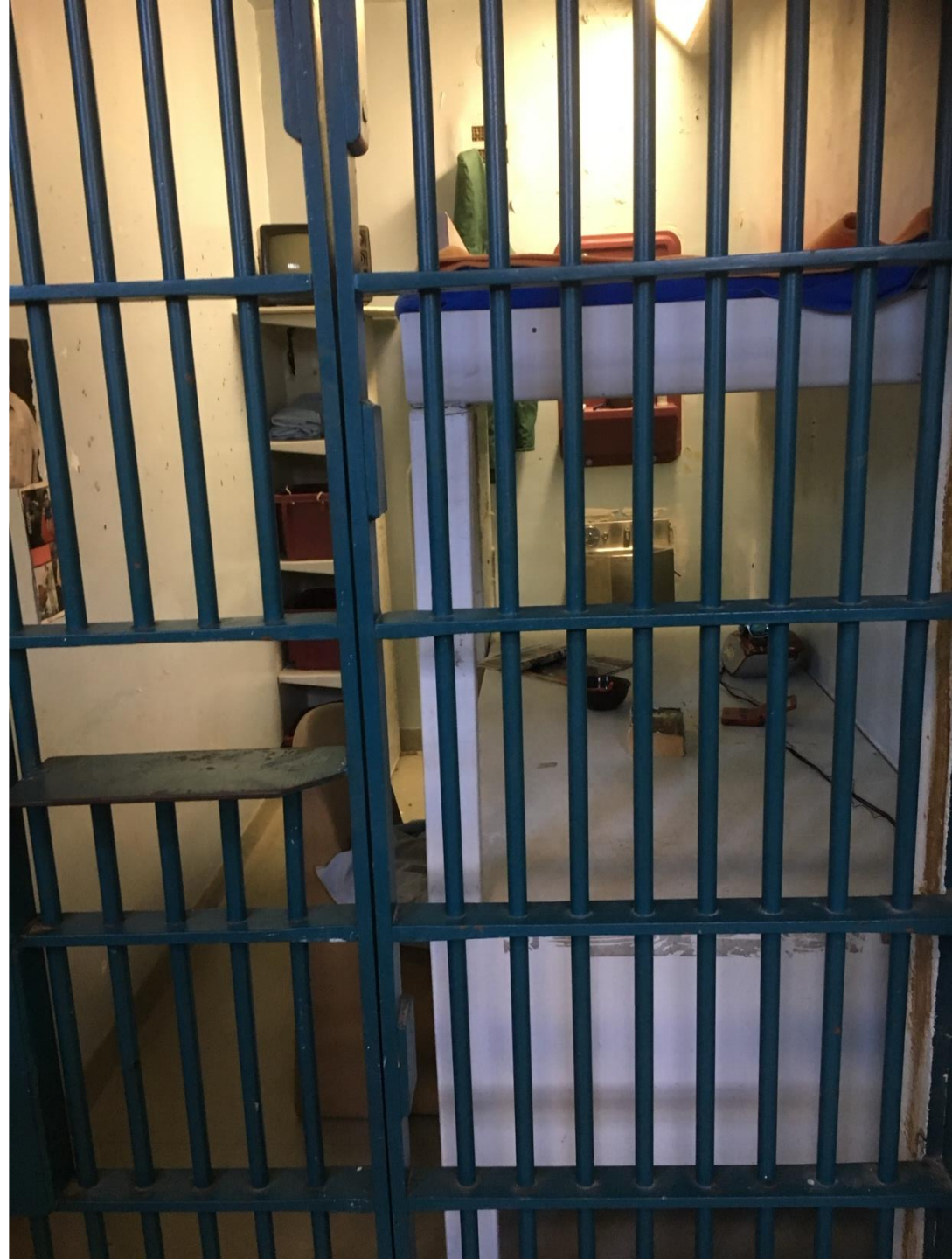

Ethical Dilemma: The Kidnapper's Confession

You are a licensed therapist who works in a maximum-security prison. One day, you are called in to meet with a new inmate, John, who has been convicted of armed robbery and is serving a ten-year sentence. During the therapy session, John confesses a kidnapping, providing details that were never known to the police. He claims to have abducted a child named Sarah, who went missing 15 years ago and was presumed dead. Sarah's family has been living with uncertainty ever since.

John explains that he kidnapped Sarah when he was a teenager himself, acting on a misguided impulse. He states that he deeply regrets his actions. He is aware of the pain he has caused Sarah's family and feels a moral obligation to reveal the truth. He swears that he did not kill her and that she was his girlfriend then. He claims that he knows where she is now.

1. Do you report John's confession to the authorities, potentially leading to a reinvigorated investigation and possible closure for Sarah's family?
2. Do you honor the therapist-client confidentiality and keep John's confession a secret, knowing that doing so may prevent Sarah's family from ever finding closure and may also allow a criminal to go unpunished?
3. Do you negotiate with John? He wants to be released if he shares the information.
